


The Chesapeake Bay is more than a beautiful body of water—it is a dynamic and sometimes dangerous natural wonder. Calm inlets and tranquil coves offer protection from the miles of open water where ocean tides surge, and clear skies can blacken with powerful storms. For watermen and other mariners, the bay presents an unpredictable mix of fair weather and foul, broad channels and convoluted tributaries, shallow water and life-threatening shoals. From colonial times until the advent of modern satellite technology, lighthouses guided mariners through these challenging waters, lighting their way home.

Of the 74 lights that once illuminated Chesapeake waters, over 30 still stand - 23 of which play important roles as aids to navigation. The Lighthouse Adventure Cruise explores lighthouses located in the middle of the Chesapeake Bay, in two different excursions, one north, one south.



All Aboard for a Lighthouse Adventure!

Join the Calvert Marine Museum for an unforgettable experience exploring lighthouses on the Chesapeake Bay with an experienced, knowledgeable guide. Traveling by water on a private charter boat, the experience is a full day of lighthouses that includes a lunch stop at a seafood restaurant.

On the Northern Cruise, you will see Cove Point (5) – a tower style built in 1828, Thomas Point (2) – a screwpile built off the coast of Annapolis in 1875, Sandy Point (1) – a caisson light built in 1858, Bloody Point (3) – another caisson built in 1882 off Kent Island, and Sharps Island Lighthouse (4), an 1882 caisson built off Tilghman Island. Lunch is at a seafood restaurant Kent Island.

Time: All cruises leave from the Drum Point Lighthouse at the Calvert Marine Museum at 7:45 a.m. Anticipated return time is 4:00 p.m.

Fee: \$130; \$120 for members. Lunch at a local restaurant; meal costs are not included

The Southern Cruise you head to Point-No-Point (7) – an octagonal caisson built in 1902 at the mouth of the Potomac River, Smith Point (9) – an 1868 caisson built at the Virginia entrance to the Potomac, Solomons Lump (8) – a caisson light built in 1875 and located offshore on the south side of Kedges Straits between Tangier Sound and Chesapeake Bay, and Hooper Island Lighthouse (6) – a caisson built in 1901 and located on middle Hooper Island. Lunch will be at a seafood restaurant on Smith Island.
